Pastor's Letter

For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; Authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace -Isaiah 9:6

These words from Isaiah announce and celebrate the birth of a new king. Written against the backdrop of Assyrian captivity, they predict a kingdom of peace and justice. As we begin Advent, I invite you to ponder the names of the Messiah and Jesus' fulfillment of those titles: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. For two thousand years, Christians have claimed Jesus as the Messiah of Hebrew Scriptures. But although Jesus was wise beyond measure and the Word enfleshed, he did not necessarily meet the expectations of a mighty king. Instead Jesus presented a new vision of leadership and prosperity, "It requires an uncommon wisdom to interrupt the foolish practice of business as usual" (Brueggemann).

The season of Advent presents an opportunity to pause and reflect on the birth of Jesus and his relevance for contemporary culture. While the world is constantly in motion and telling us what we need, our Wonderful Counselor invites us to slow down and "interrupt the foolish practice of business as usual". As a baby wrapped in bands and laid in a manger, Jesus was love and peace incarnate. Later in life, Jesus refused to compete with the power of Rome on the terms of Rome, "My kingdom is not from this world" (John 18:36). Through the narrative of his birth, life, and death, Jesus asks us to consider our own embodiment of love and peace. Interrupting business as usual opens up new possibilities that were thought to be impossible: forgiveness, generous sharing, humility, and the denial of self for the sake of a neighbor. During this holiday season, let us reconsider what is possible and the uncommon wisdom of our Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace.

Wonderful Counselor, thank you for fulfilling Isaiah's vision and showing us that a different life-giving order is possible. Make me an instrument and active part of your alternative realm on earth. Amen.



2017 Charge Conference Recap

Every year, churches throughout the Iowa Annual Conference hold a Charge Conference where any member of the church is invited to come and participate in the administrative reporting for the year. Given that there are administrative requirements to these conferences, there is automatically an air of indifference and even disinterest in general on the part of congregations heading into these events. Truth be told, the majority of the work is done ahead of time and it consists of a wealth of information about the health and direction for the ministry of the church. However, every so often, the Charge Conference ushers in a chance to see new energy and to feel the impact of the larger ministries of the local church through to the global church.

This year's Charge Conference was conducted as a "cluster", which means that several churches in our local region were gathered together under the direction of the District Superintendent. For those of us in Mount Vernon, we had the blessing of serving as host for this year's cluster and we welcomed congregations from Olin Community-Oxford Junction, Wyoming, Anamosa, Coggon and Lisbon. District Superintendent Rev. Kiboko Kiboko presided over the cluster and welcomed all to our sanctuary. For the first hour of the afternoon, Rev. Kiboko brought these churches together to talk about the mission work being done and the highlights of each ministry. The cluster was also introduced to the resources being developed by the Conference as Gabe Dorrell, Rev. Erling Shultz and Rev. Karen Nelson were given time to address the assembly. It is both an exciting and a challenging time in the ministry of the church, yet these reports evidence the power of the Holy Spirit continuing to move among the local churches and inspiring the conference to focus energy for greater support.

At the conclusion of the cluster assembly, our church representation gathered to officially document the summaries and conduct the official action to conclude the 2017 reports. For our church, this was presided over by elder, Rev. Leonard Ranson. In a very efficient and succinct manner, we moved through pastoral support forms, goal statements for each of our UMCMV ministry teams and official reports from Trustees and Staff/Parrish Relations. If you would like to see any of this information, I would love to make it available to you and to discuss any of the information.

Perhaps of greatest interest to me during this year's Charge Conference was the pastoral support forms. Each year our church conducts the preparation for the coming year of support that figures into our annual budget. This includes salaries, travel and education funding and a line item for insurance. In the rapidly changing environment of health insurance, we were particularly concerned about the value of these line items. We are blessed right now with professional experience in group health and this gave us a chance to make inquiry into the seemingly inflated benefit numbers. During the Charge Conference and the days that followed, we learned that being part of the United Methodist Church extends an opportunity for supporting the pastoral ministry of the church in a way we had not known before. In addition to the salary, housing allowance, travel and education funding, churches contribute to the general health and benefit of the ministry through what is actually a Pastoral Benefits Package, commonly misconstrued as a health insurance line item. Support for all pastors is unified through this package that includes retirement funding, coverage for poor health of any family member and the comfort of health insurance for life. The United Methodist Church establishes pastors in churches using an appointment process. Each church, based on their needs, is paired with a pastor(s) with gifts and graces that best match those needs as determined by the Bishop and her/his council. Such matches bring with it different levels of experience, health, family status and more. The freedom to appoint pastors based on the best fit and need is supported by our abiding relationship in a Conference that does not place undue burden on a small church or sacrifice the opportunities for all, including pastors. There is a grace we have found in this deeper understanding of our commitment to pastor support that has come through the important process of Charge Conference. I'll have more for you on this and the definition of apportionment soon.

Endowment Update Third quarter 2017

CAN YOU MAKE A QCD OUT OF YOUR RMD?

If you are 70½ years old or greater, you know you have to take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your retirement accounts each year. RMDs are required from all Individual Retirement Account (IRA) types except Roth IRAs, in the year in which you turn 70½ and each subsequent year. Additionally, RMDs may be required from qualified retirement plans such as 401(k)s and 403(b)s.

Legislation passed by Congress at the end of 2015 made permanent the tax treatment of retirement-plan distributions donated to charity. To receive this favorable treatment, the account owner must be 70½ or older, and the donation must be made directly from the IRA to a qualifying charity. That makes it a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) under IRS rules, and the distributed amount is not taxable to the IRA owner, whether or not you itemize deductions on your tax return. You can donate all or a portion of your RMD. The United Methodist Church of Mt. Vernon is a qualifying charity to receive QCDs. Contact the custodian of your IRA or retirement plan to

If you wish to make a yearend gift to the church, consider donating securities from your investment portfolio. The church can accept any negotiable securities: stocks, bonds, mutual funds. A gift of securities benefits the donor two ways: you receive the usual charitable tax deduction, and you avoid capital gains tax on the sale proceeds. This is especially helpful if you own securities that are worth substantially more than you paid for them. To get this favorable tax treatment, it is important that the securities are given to the church before they are sold. The church will sell them, and the proceeds can go to any church fund that you choose.
