Pastor's Letter

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him. (Hebrews 11:1, 6)

Dear Congregation,

And just like that, it's June already! Graduations have been celebrated, and continue to be celebrated, school is wrapping up, both kids and teachers are itching to get outside into the fresh air and move through the summer.

It is our faith which offers us the belief that God exists, and that God is good. Our faith offers us an assurance of the things that are unseen, and offers hope for the future. Faith is a deep and incredibly vibrant thing in our lives. Let's continue to allow our faith in God to carry us through, let us allow the salvation of Jesus Christ to bring healing and hope, and our delight and to challenge us to walk faithfully with God.

Let's allow our faith in the scriptures to transform our lives. Let's allow the Holy Spirit to carry us further. Where have you seen God be faithful to you? Where are you seeing others around you offer faithfulness? How have you been faithful? Where is God calling you to walk more deeply into faithfulness?

For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Jeremiah 29:11.

JJ Scholarship Available

College students who are entering either their junior or senior year at an accredited 4-year institution for the 2019-20 academic year and who are members of the Mt. Vernon United Methodist Church are eligible for the Julian Johnston Scholarship award administered by the church's memorial committee.

Julian Johnston, a former Mt. Vernon businessman, provided for this scholarship in his will as appreciation for money he received from this church to enable him to finish his education at Cornell. Dividends from his Chevron stock given to the church provide the funding for this scholarship. Awards may be \$500 or \$1000 depending on the number of applications and the actual funds available

Applicants need to 1) fill out a form, 2) write a one-page letter describing the financial need and their career goals, and 3) provide a letter of recommendation in order to be considered by the evaluation committee. Application forms were mailed to our church members who were high school graduates in 2016 or 2017. In case anyone is missed an application form may be obtained from the church office. There is no age limit. Applications must be received at the church office by Friday June 7, 2019. Awards will be announced within the next 30 days. —Cot Graber, Memorials Committee

#UMCNext and What Is Next for the UMC By Jim Baty, Council Chair

Greetings friends. In the spirit of transparency, I want you to be aware of some recent happenings in the UMC from a post-#GC2019 perspective, namely an event called UMC Next (#UMCNext). This event took place two weeks ago at the Church of the Resurrection in Overland Park, KS. Some of you may recognize that Resurrection is the largest UMC in the U.S. and has been a leading influencer in this discussion leading into #GC2019 and since. #UMCNext was a "by invitation" event with an intent to bring together twelve representatives from each Annual Conference in the U.S., six laity and six clergy, so that the total attendance was around 600. Over 3,000 people applied or were nominated for attendance. I was fortunate to receive an invitation from a self-nomination and I joined the Iowa delegates on the third day. The first two days I spent at a table of clergy from all across the U.S. Why did I attend? It is because our Church Council passed, by a strong majority, a declaration that the actions of #GC2019 does not reflect the social principles of our Church, nor the stated principles of the UMC. The statement disavows the action at that event and the implementation schedule for the UMC that begins January 1, 2020, which is to say we both deny responsibility for the action and we refuse to accept it. There has been significant backlash throughout the U.S. and much discussion has taken place here in this church. I wanted to find out more about what plans are being considered for "the church" to report to you.

#UMCNext was a conference intended to bring together a broad cross section of passionate interests representing persons with perspectives on social justice for LGBTQIA+ that are somewhere in the middle (Centrists) all the way to those continuing to call for full inclusion and acceptance of all people to the UMC (Progressives). The first two days we dissected the issues facing the church and heard passionate testimonies from a broad spectrum of both clergy and laity. We worshipped God together first and often and prayed constantly. We broke bread together, cried together, laughed when possible and appropriate and yes, argued and dreamed in unique and common ways. On the third day we reaffirmed our baptisms and our covenant to the church to fight injustice, oppression and persecution of all forms. With collective hearts we centered ourselves on the damage continuing to be done to persons of LGBTQIA+ orientation but were reminded continually that work continues to also fight for full racial and gender equality. You can read the public statement from the conference or here is a quick summary.

Four Commitments

The one unanimous agreement of the gathering was a set of four core principles that define both purpose and intent. They are related to the work that our Church Council has already completed but are stated in some different phrases. They were released publicly later in the week along with. In summary, they are:

- 1. We long to be passionate followers of Jesus Christ, committed to a Wesleyan vision of Christianity, anchored in scripture and informed by tradition, experience and reason as we live a life of personal piety and social holiness.
- 2. We commit to resist evil, injustice and oppression in all forms and toward all people and build a church which affirms the full participation of all ages, nations, races, classes, cultures, gender identities, sexual orientations, and abilities.
- 3. We reject the Traditional Plan approved at General Conference 2019 as inconsistent with the gospel of Jesus Christ and will resist its implementation.
- 4. We will work to eliminate discriminatory language and the restrictions and penalties in the Discipline regarding LGBTQ persons. We affirm the sacred worth of LGBTQ persons, celebrate their gifts, and commit to being in ministry together.

New Strategies

Along with this statement, the conference recognized there will be much work to do today and for many days within each local church, annual conference and jurisdictional conference in order to affect change within a denomination that is so severely divided. Such change will result in either a transformation of the church or the UMC dissolving entirely for new birth of perhaps two or more Methodist Churches united under uniquely individual principles.

This church has persons representing all perspectives on this issue and there will be significant intensity throughout the UMC Annual Conferences over the next couple of months addressing the same. Therefore, as a church family the Council also believes it is right for us to give everyone a voice toward determining if the reconciling statement the Council passed in the 1990s as well as its recent action are in fact the will of the church. From this position, we will all be better informed for whatever is asked or offered next by the UMC. Look for information soon about this all-church gathering likely to take place in the second half of June.

Tammy Nerhing from Night Shift LLC is now doing our cleaning. When asked to share a little about herself, she said: "I love Jesus.


Married 17 years to Eric, Mom of four great children. My interests include fitness and crafting".

DID YOU KNOW?....

John Wesley is known as the founder of the Methodist Church but he really didn't spend much time in America. As a little boy growing up in a Church of England family, he nearly lost his life in a fire in his home, being "saved" only by jumping out his second-floor bedroom window. To him, it was a message that he was to use this miracle to bring people the word of God.



After his education at Oxford, he began preaching outside the coal mines and on street corners to reach those whose lives were needy and empty of hope. It was a different sort of message than the one offered by the Church of England.

Soon he learned about the "heathen natives" in the new settlements in America and felt a call to go there to spread the word of Jesus Christ. He had difficulty finding the money to make the trip but eventually in 1735, he married a wealthy widow and she funded the trip for him and his brother Charles to the Ameri-can colonies. Unfortunately, the American Indians were not very receptive to his message.

After a short time, he returned somewhat bitterly to England and continued his ministry there, but not before he persuaded other preachers to also spread the Word in the colonies. One of the most eloquent of those preachers was George Whitefield (sometimes written as "Whitfield"). Whitefield was very handsome, personable, and a great preacher. He easily spread the Word, encouraging others to follow in his footsteps. Thus, the American Circuit Rider movement began.

The new state of Iowa was a prime place for the success of the Circuit Riders. "Stations", which were small one-room wooden cabins with a rope bed, a fireplace, and a small amount of supplies were placed all along the newly created road from Dubuque to Ivanhoe to Iowa City. The Circuit Riders were extremely welcome, not only as bearers of the Word but also as a link with civilization.

(Next month, we'll begin the saga of Methodist worship in actual church buildings and the beginnings of the town of "Pinhook", later to become Mount Vernon.)
