Pastor's Letter / General Conference Update

Dear Church,

I write this letter with a heavy heart. There is brokenness, and a deep divide within our church, both global and local. It's a pain that is felt across the nation, and possibly the world today.

Here are the Facts. The Traditional plan passed yesterday in the Special General Conference of the United Methodist Church. This is the plan that maintains the language that marriage is between man and woman, and will not allow for marrying or the ordination of a person who identifies as practicing a lifestyle of LGBTQ. The plan has built in increased accountability, in order to maintain these standards. In addition to this, an exit plan was passed, so that an annual conference, a congregation, or clergy can leave the body under certain criteria. From what I understand the criteria includes an all church vote at a charge conference and a vote at Annual Conference.

So, what does this mean for us? It means that we are to go on sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It means that we are to continue to do missions, to love the people, and to preach the gospel. It means we wait before we react, James says it well when he says, "we should be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry." We continue to thank God for what he has done, where he has brought us and what he is already doing. We ask him for wisdom, grace, and compassion in moving us forward. We spend a great deal of our life waiting, and God has a way of using it. There is a reason that each of these steps take time. Please engage in conversation with one of our leaders, please don't just disappear if you are disheartened.

You might be wondering what I believe, and where I stand in all of this. I believe in the traditional, orthodox teachings of scripture. I believe that the scriptures speak from the time of Creation to the point of revelation, and everything in between (our time). I believe that God created man and woman, Adam and Eve for one another. I stand behind the plan that was passed. Some might call me a traditional-ist. I understand that some read scripture differently than I do, and feel differently than I do. I love you whether you agree with me or whether you disagree.

I know that some of you may feel that you simply will no longer be able to be a part of the United Methodist Church. I honor and respect that. Our leaders are already gathering information, the nuts and bolts and the details so that you as the church can have conversations around what is next for the United Methodist Church of Mt Vernon. Stay tuned. Don't run away, no matter what you believe. Hang tight with us all.

My greatest sadness in all of this is the pain that has been caused to many. There is great hurt across our denomination and across our world. I am concerned that our witness has been crucified by the ways we have treated one another. For any part I've had in this, I am sorry. We are the same people in this church that have been in this church. Let's not run from one another. Let's be sure to put on compassion, kindness, gentleness, humility, and self-control. Let us love one another, by speaking the truth to one another in love. If you need an ear or a shoulder, feel free to reach out to me, I'd love to listen and pray.

God's grace is stretched out to you. God's love chases you, and desires for you to continue to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Let's not stop loving God and loving one another, as best as we can in this emotional time in the church.

Today I'm meeting with people, reading to make sure I have a full understanding of what all just took place, tonight I will meet with confirmands. We will be discussing Methodist history. We'll add a historic point in our conversation tonight. Tomorrow I'll get up and meet with my clergy friends, band together with a couple and confess and repent of my sins, I will pray with them, I will study and work on my sermon, I will care for those who need care, and I will prepare for Lent. I will continue to live into the ministry God is calling me into, and I hope you will too. Bless you, my friends. It is an honor to do ministry alongside of you. My prayers are with you.

Next Steps Following #GC2019

Brothers and sisters, there is no shortness of emotions following the completion of the long-awaited General Conference held in St. Louis earlier this week. What is left, is much work for the UMC and for congregations all across, primarily, the United States to determine how to finish what #GC2019 set in motion, determine individually how best to hold together the local body within communities, and replace polarity with empathy, even if that also results in varying forms of separation.

During #GC2019 this weekend, culminating Monday, February 26th, *The Way Forward*, commissioned to lead the United Methodist Church through the troubled waters of the past four decades, concluded. By a margin of 53% to 46%, the Traditional Plan, which maintains the current language of the Book of Discipline and strengthens the consequences and reparations for violations, was ratified. Additionally, the only other major element to the action was passing an addition to The Book of Discipline that defines the process for churches, conferences, pastors and bishops wishing to pursue leaving the United Methodist Church. One of the last actions taken during the conference was to send both the Traditional Plan and the Disaffiliation Process amendment to the Judiciary Council for final review. The JC will complete this during their meeting on April 23rd and render one final position on the constitutionality of the language.

What does this mean for the UMC? It means the fundamental position The Book of Discipline has carried since the late 1960's will remain. It also means that there are likely to be churches that no longer wish to be affiliated with the UMC based solely on these principles. Unless there is a change that becomes mandated from the review by the Judiciary Council, beginning as early as January, 2020, churches may begin applying for disaffiliation in accordance with the amendment. Churches have been given until December 31, 2023 to complete any disaffiliation process from the UMC.

What does this mean for our church? There is much research yet to be done. Bishop Laurie Haller will visit Salem United Methodist Church on March 10th, holding a session from 3:00 - 5:00 pm to inform those in attendance in person as well as via live feed what to expect in the timeline from the Iowa Annual Conference and updates on other important details. I will be in attendance at this meeting. The Church Council is required to hold a 1st quarter meeting and we will be delaying this until April 1st so that we can collect as much updated information as possible in advance of that April 23rd rendering by the Judicial Council. An agenda item will be the consideration for a Church Conference where every professing member has a chance to learn of the specifics and have their voice heard individually and collectively. From this Church Conference, the church may discern what unity looks like here and what directions we should take.

Each of you needs to know that to this church, you matter, your beliefs matter and your voice needs to be heard. Stay connected, stay involved and with me, become informed. While I have many details on the entirety of the process and requirements, I am still seeking additional information as it is generated in this wake from #GC2019 and much work remains to be done by the Council of Bishops and the UMC process. I do not assume to know for certainty what the future is for this church but I do know your voice, opinion and beliefs matter and need to be heard. I also know that I am willing to lead us through this so that everyone's voice is heard.

Lent is nearly here and it is time for us to let the main thing be the main thing. Let Jesus bring our salvation fully to the center, lean into Him. Please do not miss the opportunity to rejoice in the ultimate connection we have with all of Christianity, the salvation through grace in the resurrection of our risen Lord. When we have completed Lent, enough information will have been developed for all churches to be assured of the final impact of General Conference and to begin to understand the options for UMCMV, for this community, for your family, for our family.

I love you all and plan on serving alongside for as long as God will allow me to do so in this church.

Iowa Churches Step Up to Help Immigrant Groups

With all the news about building the "wall", some issues in the lives of new immigrants have gotten lost in the nation's conscience. Several churches in Iowa are stepping up to respond and at the same time are coordinating so there is no duplication of effort. Here are some examples:

DACA children and students remain in limbo. Even though they were brought here as children and have never known any life accept in America, they are constantly in danger of deportation unless there is a change in the law. The First Unitarian Church in Des Moines has set up a fund for DACA children and for Asylum seekers to begin the long and expensive process of gaining residency and citizenship. If you would like to help, send your donation to the First Unitarian Church, 1800 Bell Avenue, Des Moines IA 50315. Put DACA and/or asylum funds on your check.

The ICE raid in Mount Pleasant, Iowa, has left many families with no breadwinner. The men were deported or are still in jail, with wives and children still in Mount Pleasant with no means of support. Ever since last fall, the First Presbyterian Church in Mount Pleasant has been providing foster care and foodbanks for the families who are left behind. If you would like to help them, send your donation to First Presbyterian Church, 902 S. Walnut Street, Mount Pleasant IA 52641 and indicate "Support of Immigrant Families".

The ICE separation of families along the border has left immigrant relatives in Iowa with difficulty in locating family members and their separated children. Some family members have travelled to the border to help relatives unite with their children. The Walnut Hills United Methodist Church has begun a fund to help with this process. If you would like to donate to this cause, send your check to Walnut Hills UMC, 12321 Hickman Road, Urbandale IA 50323-1810.

There are also a number of men who were picked up at work during ICE raids who are simply stuck in jails, unable to pay their bond money that would allow them to go home. If this is a situation that touches your heart, you may send your donation to the Eastern Iowa Community Bond Project, PO Box 3174, Iowa City, 52244-3174.


