### Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends,

We have been blessed with incredible worship of our Lord and savior this month, with our generosity campaign and a little interruption from God, waking us up and calling us deeper into our prayers and our witness.

The scripture that has been on my heart as of late has been this one from James 5:13-20:

Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

Elijah was a human being, even as we are. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops.

My brothers and sisters, if one of you should wander from the truth and someone should bring that person back, remember this: Whoever turns a sinner from the error of their way will save them from death and cover over a multitude of sins.

Not only does he want to hear directly from us, but he wants us to lean into our community, so that we can lift one another up. This comes in the area of confession and forgiveness, and for praying for rain to come, or rain to stop, and for prayers for illness, and grief.

What a beautiful congregation we have that rallies around those in need. Are you willing to share your needs as well as lift the other up? Are you willing to turn to God in your most joyful moments and in your most sorrowful, regretful ones? The Lord is listening. As are we. Let us go to the Father together, dear ones.

### **Memorial Gifts**

There are two ways to memorialize a friend or loved one with a gift to the church: Gifts to the Memorial Fund are typically given in memory of a loved one, and can be earmarked for a specific purpose or added to the general Memorial account for use in the future.

Gifts to the Endowment Fund can be given as a memorial or a general gift. Funds are added to the church's endowment investments. Income from the endowment is used to support non-budgeted special projects within the church. The principal is never spent, and is left to accrue income to support the church in perpetuity.

We are grateful for the Memorial gifts received this year. One current giving opportunity is to purchase a Worship & Song hymnal in memory or honor of your loved one - \$10 suggestion for each book.

### JFON Celebration Honors Doris Knight

More than 100 people gathered Saturday, October 6, in the Coe College Alumni Building to honor Doris Knight, founder of the Iowa Justice for Our Neighbors program.


Doris was the wife of Rev. Norm Knight, pastor in our church from 1992-99. With her leadership, the first JFON clinic in the state was held in 2000. The first Cedar Rapids clinic was November 14, 2004, at Lovely Lane Methodist Church. There are now seven clinics in Iowa.

Justice for Our Neighbors (JFON) provides free legal consultation and ongoing support for immigrants seeking legal residency and citizenship for themselves or family members. The Cedar Rapids Clinic meets once a month, with over thirty volunteers from the area and three attorneys. In the Cedar Rapids clinic alone, there have been clients from 19 countries.

The UMW from our church provides an evening meal for the clinic once each year, and the Mount Vernon HS Spanish classes and Cornell, Coe, and Iowa Wesleyan students provide translation and volunteer intake services each month.



"The Lord proclaims: A voice is heard in Ramah, weeping and wailing. It's Rachel crying for her children; she refuses to be consoled because her children are no more."

Remember, Lord, your people. Forgive our sin. Reorient us in your steadfast love and remind us how to trust you. Renew in us a right spirit as we reach out with compassion to all those who are in deep grief and need our prayers, our help, and our advocacy right now. We especially lift up the families of those whose lives were tragically cut short, those who have been injured, and the one who will likely be facing federal hate-crime charges.

God, give us the courage to name evil at the same time as we work for good in the world. May each one of us become an instrument of your peace and hope. Amen.

### **ENDOWMENT — CAN YOU MAKE A QCD OUT OF YOUR RMD?**

If you are 70½ years old or greater, you know you have to take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your retirement accounts each year. RMDs are required from all Individual Retirement Account (IRA) types except Roth IRAs, in the year in which you turn 70½ and each subsequent year. Additionally, RMDs may be required from qualified retirement plans such as 401(k)s and 403(b)s.

Legislation passed by Congress at the end of 2015 made permanent the tax treatment of retirement-plan distributions donated to charity. To receive this favorable treatment, the account owner must be 70½ or older, and the donation must be made directly from the IRA to a qualifying charity. That makes it a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) under IRS rules, and the distributed amount is not taxable to the IRA owner, whether or not you itemize deductions on your tax return.

Tax law changes that took effect in 2018 limit some taxpayers' ability to deduct charitable contributions, making a QCD even more valuable as a tax planning tool for those who qualify.

You can donate all or a portion of your RMD. The United Methodist Church of Mt. Vernon is a qualifying charity to receive QCDs. Contact the custodian of your IRA or retirement plan to learn how you can donate your RMD, help the church, and save some taxes!

### **NOVEMEBER WAY FORWARD UPDATE**

Dear Friends,

I just returned from the Annual Orders event with the Bishop. Clergy from across the conference gathered together in Marshalltown at First United Methodist Church, and had opportunities to take part in a discussion series called Point Of View. In this we were working to build empathy for one another in each of our perspectives on the Way Forward. This was a challenging, but good gathering, where we were assigned a small group and offered questions for discussion with a moderator leading our conversation with videos, and material to walk with us. We looked at four different frames of people that may be engaging in this conversation. 1. The Traditionalist Perspective, 2. The individual who identifies as LGBTQ+, 3. The advocate of the person who identifies as LGBTQ+, 4. The person whom feels that there are other things we should be spending our time on. The hope was to put ourselves in each person's shoes, and begin to build empathy so that we can continue to have the difficult conversation with love and grace. It was a great opportunity.

We continue to await what the delegates will decide come February 2019 as the special general conference. The Judicial Council of the UMC met this month to look at the three plans which have been proposed by the Way Forward. You can click <a href="here">here</a> to read their full report. The task at hand was to discern whether the language in the three plans was constitutional or not. Regarding the One Church plan – they found that this was mostly constitutional. Regarding the Traditionalist plan, they found that there was some language that would need changing. The Council was unwilling to make any rulings on the Connectional Conference plan because it requires constitutional amendments. This was helpful as we now know what language needs to be adapted, and this can be done on the general conference floor, before passing any specific plans for our way forward.

Please continue to lift up our general conference delegates, our bishops, our pastors, and our churches in this strenuous time in the church. Also, in the midst of the challenges that lie ahead, let us remember that the church of Jesus Christ has been around for thousands of years, and the kingdom of God remains with us. We will continue to lean into the Love of our Father in Heaven, we will continue to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, through the power of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us. We will continue to treat our brothers and sisters with kindness, and gentleness, with compassion, grace, and love. We will continue to be a church that opens our doors to our brothers and sisters, for we know and recognize that all people are of sacred worth.
