#### Pastor's Letter

Dear Church,

Have you ever felt like you were supposed to do or say something, but it seemed so strange or foolish? This year at the New Room Conference we worshiped the Lord, and continued to pray for a great awakening among the church, a great revival. Once again I was reminded of the beauty of the way the Lord speaks, and heals. There was a speaker by the name of Mike Pilavachi. He made a covenant with God some years ago that whatever God said, he would say. He said that he realized that if he was wrong and that if it was him, that no one would die. But, if it was from God, that something awesome could happen! (Paraphrased) This really spoke to me. God says some crazy things sometimes, and there are examples of ways that Mike that he heard God, and so he tried it out, and he felt foolish, and yet, God brought incredible healing, and new life to many people through this obedience? What is God saying to you? Are you to share it? One of his greatest themes was obedience.

I'm struck that so often in our world today we get caught up in what people's personal truths are, we stop calling people into an obedient relationship with the Lord. God has set up systems, boundaries, and ways to protect us, just like parents protect their children, there are things that are good for us and bad for us, and we are to be obedient to what God has to say to us. There is one foundational truth that is found throughout scripture that says, if you speak your faith in Jesus as your savior, you will have life eternal. This same truth says that if we have faith it will reveal itself through our love. Our understanding of our great need, and our understanding of our great hunger and thirst will bring us to a place of humility, and unconditional love of God our savior.

Ashley Mathews was the opening speaker at the conference, the quote that resonated in my heart from her was, "Have you thought about the power and consequence of you being in right standing with God?" When we are in right standing with God, when we are obedient to him, when we allow ourselves to be cleansed by his blood, when we sit at his feet, when we worship with all of our hearts, and when we surrender our lives fully to Christ, that is when God can work in and through us. Have you ever considered how many people your life touches in a day, a week, a month or a year? Have you ever considered who it is that God is calling you into relationship with for the sole purpose of showing God's love to them, and revealing more of God's love and truth to them?

God is a merciful, and grace-filled God. He is full of mercy and compassion, and at the very same time, he is a God that protects, and desires to have us close to him. Our great commission, the thing God has called each and every one of us to, I offer, the sole purpose of our life is to share the redeeming love of Christ with those around us.

So, as you enter a new month, as the leaves fall off of the trees, as you proceed to rake and enjoy the brisk fall air, will you consider what God is calling you to? Is he calling you into deeper obedience? Deeper faith? Deeper trust? Deeper Hope? Let's cling to him, my dear friends.

### "Imagine No Malaria": Impact on Africa

Recently, at a Church Council breakfast, someone asked whatever happened to the UMC effort to "Imagine No Malaria"? We, as well as many churches in Iowa, had sponsored a pancake supper and various other fund-raising strategies as our participation. I promised to research it and let our church know the results.

The Iowa UMC effort reached its goal in 2014. Here is what was accomplished:

For the churches in the Iowa Annual Conference, over \$2 million was raised by July, 2014. The Conference goal was \$1.8 million. There was a great celebration at the 2014 Annual Conference.

This effort, at the Global level among all United Methodist Churches in the world, accomplished the following between August 2012 to July 2014.:

The UMC stopped shipping mosquito nets but enabled factories built in Africa to begin production of them. The UMC purchased 4 million nets from those local factories to provide for families and hospitals.

The UMC supported the training and employment of thousands of local hospital staff and social workers who in turn treated more than 2.7 million children and babies, and provided education for their parents.

175,000 structures were sprayed with mosquito repellant.

The mortality rates from malaria in Africa dropped 60% in two years' time.

As of the Annual Conference of 2018, the Iowa United Methodist Church has joined other UMC's in a new effort....Providing Awareness and Understanding about Mental Illness and Advocating for Services/ Treatment for Victims and Families.







#### Former UMCMV Pastor's Wife to be Honored in October

**Doris Knight**, wife of former Pastor Norm Knight who was our UMCMV pastor in the early 2000's, will be honored as the developer and first "director" of Iowa's Justice for Our Neighbors (JFON) at a special ceremony October 6 in Cedar Rapids.

The ceremony will take place at the very first "JFON Leadership Achievement" Awards Ceremony and reception at Coe College's Clarke Alumni Center on Saturday, October 6, from 11:30-2:00.

Doris led the beginning of the Iowa JFON Methodist free legal clinics for immigrants and refugees for fifteen years until she retired a few years ago. She devoted herself to the development of this ministry in Iowa, without pay, and aligned it with the already established National Justice for Our Neighbors Methodist ministry.

Special speaker during the ceremony will be Deepa Iyer, lawyer, scholar and writer from The Center for Social Inclusion where she provides analysis and research on equity and solidarity in America's changing racial landscape. She herself immigrated from India when she was twelve years old. Her groundbreaking book, <u>We Too Sing America</u>, was selected by the American Librarians Association to be one of the top ten multicultural nonfiction books of 2016. She was also a trial attorney for the U. S. Department of Justice.

It was "written jointly by a theologically diverse group of clergy from the West Ohio Conference." They write that, "Regardless of whichever option is adopted, we believe that a "Gracious Exit" will be necessary for some local churches and clergy so we might all be able to move forward in an attitude of love and peace." The letter was originally signed by 16 clergy and lay members of the West Ohio conference and since has added at least a couple of hundred signatures from across the nation. This letter requests that this is voted on prior to any of the selected plans before them, hoping it will bring some peace in the midst of a very anxious space and time.
